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Employers will notice what you are wearing. Traditional attire for an interview ranges from business casual to business professional depending on the position.

Business Professional I Interviews, Career Fairs, Formal Workplaces, Some Networking Events



<u>Women's Business Professional</u>
neutral blouse, blazer, matching pants or skirt,
close-toed heels or flats, modest accessories
and makeup, neat fingernails



<u>Men's Business Professional</u>
button down shirt, tie, blue/navy or black pants,
blazer jacket to match pants, black or cognac
shoes (depending on color of pants/jacket), neat
fingernails & facial hair

Virtual Dress Code Tip: Despite the temptation to not dress up from the waist down during virtual professional interactions, wearing basketball shorts with a tie is not recommended. You never know what might cause you to need to stand up during a call. Beyond just the possibility of humiliation, however, dressing for success is a mindset. If you dress like a slob, you will feel like a slob, and that will impact your self-confidence and ability to perform.

Women's Business Casual
patterned or neutral blouse, cardigan, scarf,
khaki pants, dress, skirt, booties, flats



<u>Men's Business Casual</u> polos, button down without blazer, khakis, brown shoes, sports coat, vest, sweater

What Not to Wear I Most workplaces will prohibit these kinds of items



- Shorts
- \bullet $\,\,$ Crop tops, halter tops, tube tops, any revealing top
- Sweatshirts or sweatpants, or any kind of athletic clothing
- Hoodies or hats
- Clothing with holes in it
- Unironed or very wrinkled, frumpy clothing
- Graphic t-shirts, especially with violent or offensive content
- Two-piece dresses or short rompers
- Open-toed shoes
- Tennis shoes
- Clothing that is too tight
- Overly large jewelry
- Flip flops or slippers





Smart Casual I Very Casual Workplaces with Little External Interaction, Casual Fridays



Women's Smart Casual Denim, khaki slacks, dressy tops or blouses with a cardigan or other cover-up, blazer, close-toed shoes (booties, flats)



Men's Smart Casual Denim or khaki trousers, vest, tie, sport coat, polo shirt, button-up shirt, leather shoes

Black Tie I Formal evening wear typically only worn to prestigious events after 6 p.m.



Women's Black Tie Floor-length gown, jewelry, heels



Men's Black Tie Tuxedo, vest, cufflinks, tie
